The West Virginia Reads 150 challenge has been so popular that the West Virginia Library Commission, the West Virginia Center for the Book and Kanawha County Public Library are continuing the program for another year with the West Virginia Reads 150 Plus reading challenge. Form your team of any size to read a minimum of 151 books between January 1 and December 31, 2014. Teams are encouraged to set their own goals. Read at least 151 books, but the sky is the limit. Choose a team name and select one team leader to keep track of books read by the team. Team members report each book read to the team leader. All ages are eligible to participate. Families can use this challenge to promote reading at home. If a team member is too young or unable to read, books read to them can be counted toward the team goal. KCPL summer reading clubs will continue as usual, and you can count the books you read for both your summer reading club and the WV Reads 150 Plus challenge. Also, if you are participating in the Adult Winter Viewing Club, you may count any movie you watch that is based on a book for the West Virginia Reads 150 Plus challenge.
